THIS IS TO CERTIFY that the QUE PERL lode mining claim was located by:

on the 18th day of June, 1971, situated in the Mining District, LINCOLN County, State of NEVADA, and about 5 miles from ACOMA and about 4 1/2 miles from Nevada-Utah State line believed to be in T. 45. R. 70 E.

We (or I) claim 1500 linear feet along the course of the mineral-bearing ledge, lode or vein, extending 900 feet from the location monument in a NW direction, and 600 feet in a SE direction, together with 300 feet on each side of the center of the ledge for the entire length of the claim.

The discovery work consists of a dig pit and trench located about 35 feet in a NW direction from the location monument, and its dimensions are feet wide, feet long and feet deep, exposing ledge, lode or vein in place.

The northwest corner is marked by a post 4" x 4" 4 feet high, inscribed "NW Corner of the Que Perl Claim;" the southwest corner is marked by a post 4 feet high, inscribed "SW Corner of the Que Perl Claim;" the southeast corner is marked by a 4" x 4" post 4 feet high, inscribed "SE Corner of the Que Perl Claim;" the northeast corner is marked by a post 4 feet high, inscribed "NE Corner of the Claim." There is also a at the center of each side line. The discovery work has been done, and the location completed since June 25, 1971.
