DIAGRAM OF CLAIM—The location (discovery point) and corner monuments should be designated on the accompanying diagram to make the record of claim more perfect.

A mining claim must not exceed 1500 feet in length along the vein or lode, by 600 feet in width, 300 feet on each side of center of vein at surface.

No location of a mining claim can be made until the discovery of the vein or lode within the limits of the ground claimed.


The claim must be distinctly marked on the ground, so its boundaries can be readily traced.
