NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN That the undersigned, having complied with the requirements of SECTION 2324 of the REVISED STATUTES of the United States, and the Local Laws, Customs and Regulations of this District, has located 1500 feet in length by 600 feet in width, on this the Le Jan. #4 Lode, Vein

or Deposit bearing Gold, Silver, Copper, Lead, and other valuable minerals, situated About 9 miles from D T Ranch (Matogue) and about 5 miles North of Simpson Fairwell in the Lincoln Mining District Lincoln County, State of Nevada

NOTE

◆ **DIAGRAM OF CLAIM**—The location (discovery point) and corner monuments should be designated on the accompanying diagram to make the record of claim more perfect.

A mining claim must not exceed 1500 feet in length along the vein or lode, by 600 feet in width, 300 feet on each side of center of vein at surface.

No location of a mining claim can be made until the discovery of the vein or lode within the limits of the ground claimed.


The claim must be distinctly marked on the ground, so its boundaries can be readily traced.

A severe penalty is provided by law for removing or defacing the stakes or monuments of a mining claim.

Claims located on Sunday or holidays are legal.

All valuable mineral deposits in lands of the Government are locatable by citizens of the United States only, and those who have declared their intentions to become such.

This location notice must be filed for Record with the County Recorder of the County in which claim is located.
