NOTE

* **DIAGRAM OF CLAIM** - The location (discovery point) and corner monuments should be delineated on the accompanying diagram to make the record of claim more perfect.

A mining claim must not exceed 1500 feet in length along the vein or lode, by 600 feet in width, 200 feet on each side of center of vein at surface.

No location of a mining claim can be made until the discovery of the vein or lode within the limits of the ground claimed.

The claim must be distinctly marked on the ground so its boundaries can be readily traced.

A severe penalty is provided by law for someone who falsifies the stakes or monuments of a mining claim.

Claims located on Sunday or holidays are legal.

Valuable mineral deposits in lands of the United States are locatable by either of the following methods, and the claimant must choose one of them to be effective.

1. Discovery of a valuable mineral deposit.

2. Discovery of a valuable mineral deposit by the use of a shaft, tunnel, or other means.

The location must be filed in the county clerk's office within 90 days of the date of discovery.
