

NOTE	
DIAGRAM OF CLAIM — The location (discovery) point and corner monuments should be designated on the accompanying diagram to make the record of claim more perfect.	
A mining claim must not exceed 1600 feet in length along the vein or lode, by 600 feet in width, 300 feet on each side of center of vein at surface.	
No location of a mining claim can be made until the discovery of the vein or lode, or the finding of the ground claimed.	
The claim must be distinctly marked on the ground so its boundaries can be readily traced.	
A severe penalty is provided by law for removing or defacing the stakes or monuments of a mining claim.	
Claims located on Sunday or holidays are legal.	
All valuable mineral deposits in lands of the Government are locatable by citizens of the United States only, and those citizens so declare their intentions to be done.	
This location notice must be filed to record with the County Recorder of the county in which claim is located.
