The Claim is approximately 1,500 feet long and 600 feet wide, such that 1,480 feet is claimed in a northerly direction and 20 feet in a southerly direction from the point of discovery (monument of location), at which the Notice of Location was posted, together with 300 feet on each side of the monument of location and center line of the Claim. The general course of the lode or vein is from the south to the northerly direction.
