The Claim is approximately 1,500 feet long and 600 feet wide, such that 1,480 feet is claimed in a southerly direction and 20 feet in a northerly direction from the point of discovery (monument of location), at which the Notice of Location was posted, together with 300 feet on each side of the monument of location and center line of the Claim. The general course of the lode or vein is from the north to the southerly direction.
