CERTIFICATE OF LOCATION  
LODE MINING CLAIM

C.I.M. # 119 Lode Mining Claim

This is to certify that the Walker Lane Joint Venture (a joint venture between BHP-Utah International Inc., a Delaware corporation, and Nippon Mining of Nevada, a Nevada Corporation) did on the 13th day of May, 19 90, locate, and claim, and does hereby locate and claim by right of discovery and location, and in compliance with the Mining Laws of the United States and the State of Nevada, and the local customs and rules of the district in which the claim is located, the lode mining claim called the C.I.M. # 119

in the Northern 1/2 of Section 11, T. 4 S., R. 58 E., M.D.M., in the

Fabranegat Mining District, Lincoln County, State of Nevada. The general course of the lode or vein as near as can be determined is in an East-West direction from the discovery monument upon which the Notice of Location is posted. The undersigned claims 1480 feet in a Westerly direction and 20 feet in an Easterly direction from the discovery monument together with 300 feet on each side of the center of the vein at the surface.

The position and number of each corner and side line center of this claim is shown on the Mining Claim Map recorded herewith. The number, position and markings on each corner or side center monument is as follows:

As erected on the ground, each corner and sideline center monument consists of a wooden post 1/ at least 3/4 inches in diameter 2/ by 4 feet in length set one foot in the ground and is marked as described above by an aluminum tag attached 3/ to the monument. The monumentation and marking of the above-described corners and sideline centers on the ground was completed within 60 days from the date of posting the Notice of Location. The work of location consisted of making and recording duplicate claim maps 4/ and payment of the fees prescribed by NRS 517.040.

- 1/ A metal post or a durable plastic pipe is also authorized.
- 2/ If metal post used, it must be at least 2 inches in diameter. If a durable plastic pipe is used, it must be at least 3 inches in diameter.
- 3/ Posts may also be scribed or marked giving the claim name, monument number, and position. The claim map must be at a scale of not less than 500 feet to the inch, which sets forth the position of the monuments in relation to each other and establishes numbers of boundary monuments. The size of each sheet must be 24 x 32 inches.
- 4/ Where the land has been surveyed by the United States, the description must be connected by corners and distances to an official corner of the public land survey. Where the land has not been surveyed by the United States or where official corners cannot be found through the exercise of due diligence, the description must be tied by courses and distances to a natural landmark or a readily identifiable artificial landmark which is customarily shown on a map, including, without limitation, a bench mark or the point at which two roads intersect. The description must also state the township and range, and where the lands are surveyed lands the quarter section and section in which the landmark and mining claims are situated must begin.
