AFFIDAVIT OF ANNUAL ASSESSMENT WORK FOR THE YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 1, 1990

STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS and REPORT OF BASIC FINDINGS

This detailed report is filed in compliance with the requirements of Title 30, United States Code, Section 28-1 for the claims of the Ely Valley and West End Property, a group of 93 unpatented lode claims and 31 patented lode claims situated in Lincoln County, State of Mevada.

The work consisted of a geophysical survey covering all of each claim and a geological survey of a portion of the claims to evaluate the discovery of valuable mineral deposits located thereon, to locate hidden ore controls, and to survey work was performed during the period from February 21, 1990, through february 24, 1990, by and under the direction of Richard Van Blaricom, a geophysicist with over twenty-eight (28) years experience in the mineral industry with degrees from Portland State University and the University of Arizona (B.S. Geology and M.S. Geophysics, respectively), whose address is North 22710 Perry Rd., Cobert, Washington 99005, and by Robert W. Hennessey, a geophysicist with over 16 years of geophysical experience in the mineral industry, whose address is East 11413 Frederick, Spokane Washington 99206. The geological survey work was performed during the period from November 14, 1989, through November 22, 1989, by James M. Telford whose address is 1445 South 1500 East, Salt Lake City, Utah 84105, a geologist with fifteen (15) years experience in the mineral industry with a degree from Tennessee Technological University (B.S., 1975). All of the geophysical and geological survey work was done under the direction geophysicist with over twenty-eight (28) years experience in the mineral industry All of the geophysical and geological survey work was done under the direction and supervision of James M. Telford. The cost of the geophysical and geological survey work exceeded Thirteen Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$13,500.00) and was paid for by Cominco American Resources Incorporated, owner and optionee of the subject mining claims.

The geophysical survey was planned to establish the depth to bedrock on the downdropped portion of a range front fault under pediment cover and to test for sulfide responses from within the bedrock. The survey technique employed was a SUITIDE responses from within the bedrock. The survey technique employed was a CS-AMT survey. Four northeast-trending lines were surveyed using an "a" spacing of 500 feet with a station interval of 500 feet. The frequencies used were from 2048 Hz to 2 Hz. Lines were spaced at 4,500 foot intervals. The geological survey work consisted of geologic mapping at a scale of 100' to 1" of the Startup, Startup No.2, Marion, Marion No.2, Ely Valley, Ely Valley No.3, Ely Valley No.4, OK No.4, OK No.5, OK No.7, Hard Roades, and Gelder unpatented and patented claims and logging of drill core and cuttings from the Startup, Marion, Marion No.6, Ely Valley No.4, OK No.2, OK No.3, OK No.7, and Alice unpatented and patented claims to aid in the interpretation of the geophysical survey. The patented claims, to aid in the interpretation of the geophysical survey. The results of the CS-AMT survey indicate that depth to bedrock is in excess of 2000 feet and no responses that could be interpreted as sulfide-generated were recorded.

An exploration-development program consisting of drilling, sampling, and additional other studies is under consideration for this property. All technical work and results are in the possession of and are considered to be the exclusive property of Cominco American Resources Incorporated.
