SPECIAL STIPULATIONS FOR OIL AND GAS LEASING WITHIN THE ELY DISTRICT

The Lessee shall comply with the following special conditions and stipulations unless they are modified by mutual agreement of the lessee, and the Bureau of Land Management's authorized officer:

- A. No drilling or storage facilities will be allowed within 500 feet of any pond, reservoir, canal, spring or stream. Other buffer zones and areas near water may be restricted to protect riparian habitat. This distance may be modified when specifically approved in writing by the Ely District Manager, BLM. Restricted surface occupancy may be required in other buffer zones to protect other resource values, including threatened or endangered flora and fauna.
- B. To secure specific compliance with the stipulations under Sec. 6, paragraph (2) of the oil and gas lease form, the lessee shall, prior to operations, furnish to the authorized officer, a certified statement that either no archaeological values exist or that they may exist on the leased lands to the best of the lessee's knowledge and belief and that they might be impaired by oil and gas operations. Such certified statement must be completed by a qualified archaeologist acceptable to the authorized officer.
- If the lessee furnishes a statement that archaeological values may exist where the land is to be disturbed or occupied, the lessee will engage a qualified archaeologist, acceptable to the authorized officer, to survey and salvage, in advance of any operations, such archaeological values on the lands involved. The responsibility for the cost for the certificate, survey and salvage will be borne by the lessee, and such salvaged property shall remain the property of the lessor or the surface owner.
- C. The use of wide or balloon tired vehicles and/or helicopters may be required for any activities in off-road areas where deemed necessary to protect the soil and other resources.
- D. Springs and water developments on Federal lands may be used only with the prior written approval of the authorized officer.

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E. The lease area may contain critical habitat for wild and free roaming horses and burros. Therefore, prior to entry onto the lands within the described areas the lessee (operator) will discuss the proposed activities with the surface management agency's authorized officer, who may require additional measures for the protection of the horses and burros.

Such measures may include:

- a. The fencing of mud pits on drill sites.b. The protection of springs and water developments.c. The rehabilitation of areas of surface disturbance to reestablish the vegetative cover.
- F. To maintain aesthetic values, all semi-permanent and permanent facilities will be painted or camouflaged to blend with the natural surroundings. The paint selection or method of camouflage will be subject to approval by the authorized officer.
- G. In order to minimize watershed damage during muddy and/or wet periods, the Bureau of Land Management's authorized officer, may prohibit exploration, drilling or other development. This limitation does not apply to maintenance and operations of producing wells.
