The claim is 1500 feet long and 600 feet wide, such that 20 feet is claimed in a S direction and 480 feet is claimed in a N direction from the location monument, together with 300 feet on each side of the monument of location and center line of the claim. The general course of the claim is NORTH-SOUTH

The boundaries of this claim are monumented with 2 inch by 2 inch by 4 foot long wooden posts. Each monument is marked with a scribed metal tag, which states the claim name and number, and the location of the monument with respect to the claim.

The corner monuments were erected within 60 days of the posting of this notice of location. To locate the monuments, begin at the northeast corner of the claim and travel:

1500 feet SOUTH to the SE corner, thence
600 feet WEST to the SW corner, thence
1500 feet NORTH to the NW corner, thence
600 feet EAST to the NE corner of the claim.

The location work included the making of a claim map as provided in NRS 517.040, a copy of which is filed with the county recorder.
