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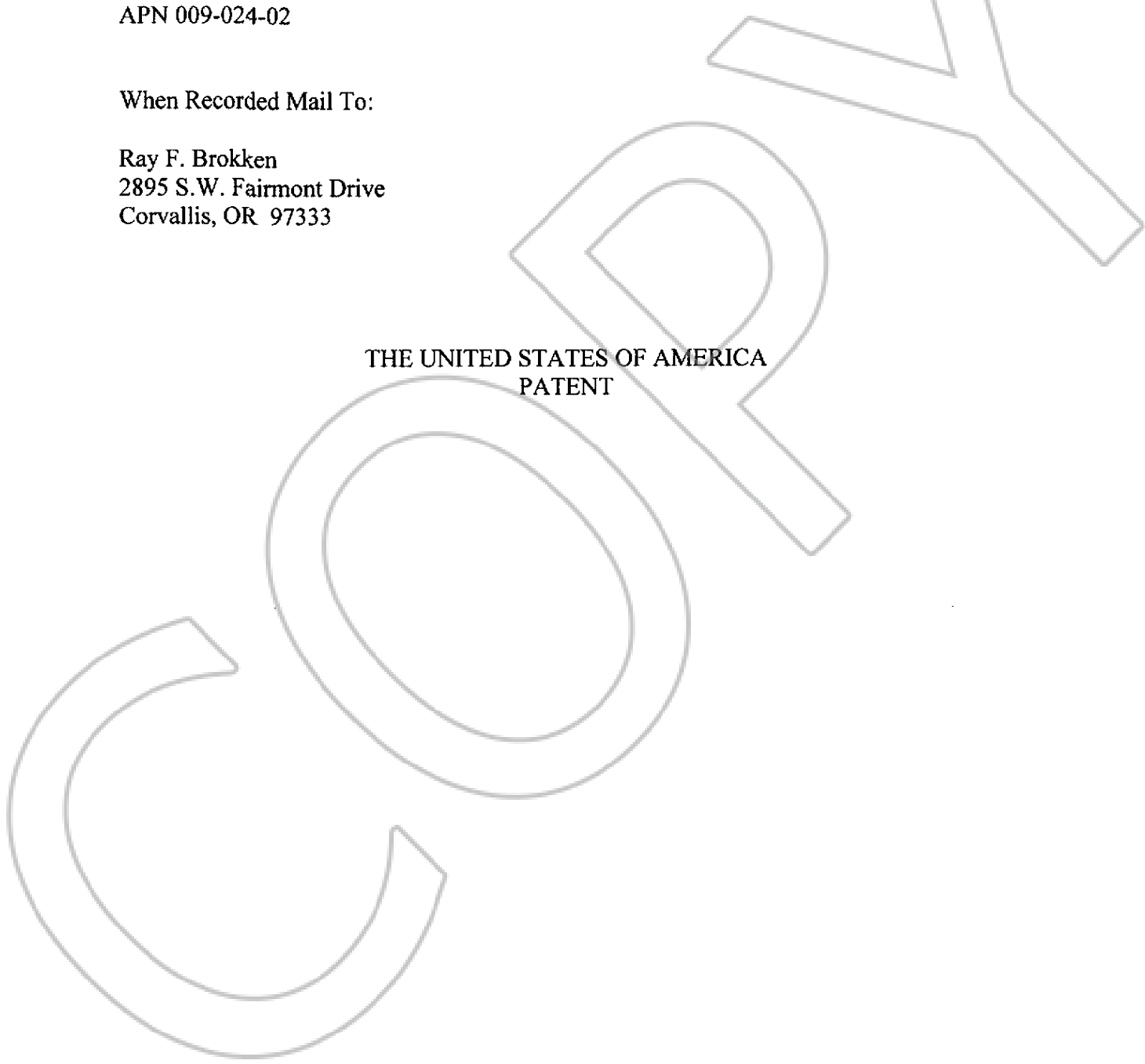

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME GREETING

Whereas, in pursuance of the provisions of the several Statutes of the United States, Chapter Title Thirty Two, and legislation supplemental thereto, there have been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States the Plat and Field Notes of survey and the Certificate No. 628 of the Register of the Land Office at Carson City in the State of Nevada accompanied by other evidence whereby it appears that A. W. McCune, Ben Johnson, and the heirs of W. L. Hoge, deceased,

did, on the thirtieth day of July A. D. 1901, duly enter and pay for that certain mining claim of production, known as the Horse Shoe No. 1, Horse Shoe No. 2, Horse Shoe No. 3, Horse Shoe No. 4, Boyan and Boyan Extension Lode mining claims designated by the Surveyor General as lot No. 1902 embracing a portion of the unappropriated public domain

in the Eagle Valley Mining District, in the County of Lincoln and State of Nevada in the District of Lone subject to sale at Carson City

Now Know All That there is therefore hereby GRANTED by the UNITED STATES unto the said

A. W. McQuinn, Ben Johnson and the heirs of W. L. Hage, deceased

and to their heirs... and assigns, the following premises hereinafter described and not excepted from these patents... Section 2, Range 3, Township 4, Range and Organ... extends downward vertically, although such veins, lodes, or ledges... Provided, that the right of possession to such outside parts of said veins, lodes, or ledges, shall be confined to such position thereof as the lode or vein... And provided further, that nothing herein contained shall authorize the grantee herein to enter upon the surface of a claim owned or possessed by another.

To have and to hold said mining properties, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature hereunto, belonging unto the said grantee, his heirs, assigns, and assigns forever, unto the said heirs, assigns, and assigns forever, subject nevertheless to the provisions and

to the following conditions and stipulations:

First, That the premises hereby granted, with the exception of the surface, may be entered by the proprietor of any other vein, lode, or ledge, the top or apex of which lies outside of the boundary of said grant premises, should the same in its dip be found to penetrate, cross, or extend into said premises for the purpose of extracting and removing the ore from such other vein, lode, or ledge.

Second, That the premises hereby granted shall be held subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs and other connection with such water rights as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local laws, customs, and decisions of courts. And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way, easement, or ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

Third, That in the absence of necessary legislation by Congress, the Legislature of Nevada may provide rules for working the mining claims and premises hereby granted, including assessments, drainage, and other necessary means to its complete development.

In testimony whereof, Thomas Roosevelt, President of the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters Patent and the Grant of the FEDERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
